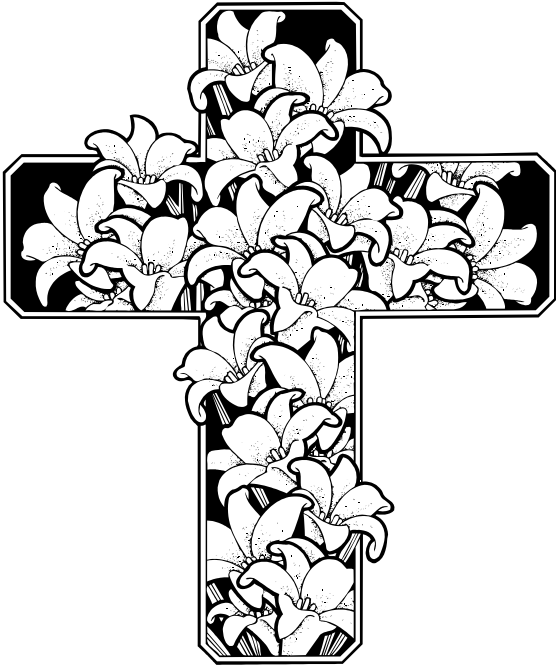

Final Doctoral Organ Recital

Chad Winterfeldt, a doctoral candidate at UNL in organ performance, will present his final doctoral recital at St. Paul United Methodist Church, 1144 M Street, on Tuesday, April 29 at 7:00 p.m.

The program includes selections from the avant-garde *Organbook I* by William Albright, the sometimes tongue-in-cheek *Free Fantasia on 'O Zion, Haste'* and *'How Firm a Foundation'* from William Bolcom's fourth book of Gospel Preludes, and the late romantic *Fantasia and Fugue in D minor, op 135b* by Max Reger. Works by Widor and Messiaen are also included.

The recital is free of charge and the public is cordially invited to attend._

Timothy Albrecht has played to acclaim in North and South America, Europe and Asia. Albrecht is professor of music and university organist at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, where he heads the organ masters program in the department of music and Candler School of Theology. His teaching schedule includes one month of teaching in Vienna every summer. He is composer of *Grace Notes*, a multi-volume set of compositions based on hymn tunes. The *Philadelphia Inquirer* praises his "stunning technique, with an ability to project personality through his unique style."_



Philip Hahn, AAGO - 28th President of AGO - Dies at Age 67

Philip Hahn died peacefully at his home in San Francisco April 13th from complications of myelofibrosis, a disease of the bone marrow. A memorial service will be held May 4th at St. John's Episcopal Church in Ross, California where he served as organist/choirmaster from 1990 until his death. His term of president for the AGO was 1998-2002.
