#### **Board Member Picks**



Piet Post, <u>Fantasy on the Hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy"</u>, Presser 163-00033 (standard print) or 163-00033D (digital download). An oldie, but a goodie! Written for manuals only, but you can add a pedal part easily if you'd like.



The Ultimate Organ Book compiled by Hal Hopson. Hope Publishing Item 8135 or 8315DP (digital download). The volume contains 151 titles of varying difficulties. Carol McDaniel writes: "Whenever I sub somewhere for the first time, I always take this book, just in case. I have the full unabridged version of many of the pieces included here, but I love having these all in one volume."
