### Organ Lesson Scholarships are now Available!

Please help us spread the word! Through the Lillian Slaughter Memorial Fund, the Lincoln Chapter of the AGO is excited to begin offering scholarships in the amount of \$500 per year to organists of any age, beginning or advanced, who wish to study with a current member of our chapter. The scholarship money should primarily be used to assist with the cost of lessons but may also be used to purchase organ shoes and music. Please note that the <u>student</u> does not need to be a member of the AGO to receive a scholarship.

Our chapter <u>website</u> now contains information about the scholarship program as well as a short online application to complete. One the application has been received, our committee will verify instruction with the listed teacher and then be in touch with the applicant about payment of the funds.

These scholarships are a wonderful and exciting way to encourage people in their study of the organ, especially those who may want to begin learning. If someone would like to study, but isn't sure how to find a teacher, we can help with that too; there is a space on the application form to indicate if you would like the AGO to put you in contact with a local teacher.
